

Donor Spotlight: Amy & Jeff Brinling

For Amy and Jeff Brinling, supporting Asbury Woods started with proximity and grew into purpose. Living near Brown's Farm, their family spent years exploring the trails, an experience Amy says "deepened our appreciation for this incredible community treasure." When she later joined the Board of Directors, the couple gained a fuller understanding of the organization's mission and potential. "The more we learned about its educational outreach and vision for the future," she explains, "the more committed we became to supporting its work."



As outgoing Board Chair, Amy has seen firsthand how intentional growth creates value for the community. One highlight during her tenure was the acquisition of more than 40 acres of land, including the cherished Buttermilk Falls property. "Thanks to the generosity of our donors," she notes, "that expansion is now fully paid for." She also emphasizes the importance of talent and leadership, adding, "Asbury Woods has assembled a passionate team dedicated to advancing the mission and ensuring the organization continues to thrive."

Philanthropy, for the Brinlings, comes down to confidence in impact. "Our support is being used wisely and is making a difference," Amy says. Jeff and Amy are particularly motivated by programs that connect children with the environment. "We've always had a special place in our hearts for causes that inspire and educate children," Amy says, and they see Asbury Woods doing exactly that through hands-on science, sustainability education, and creative community events.

Asbury Woods' recent programming, including the popular Winnie the Pooh–themed event, stands out as an example of thoughtful engagement. "It brought together fun, learning, and nature in such a magical and imaginative way," Amy says, adding that seeing children explore and connect with nature through these experiences "leaves a lasting impression."

Looking toward the future, Amy and Jeff believe Asbury Woods is well-positioned for long-term community impact. "Its potential to enrich our community for generations is tremendous," she says. She encourages others who are considering getting involved to see their contribution as a true investment. Homeschool programs with pre-lessons and extension activities are back! Sign up for one or all the classes below. All classes meet the PA STEELS Standards, and registered participants will receive a certificate of completion. Parents may drop their children off or choose to stay with them regardless of age.



January 22 – Forest Management

Learn about forest land management through various games to understand what causes wildfires, their impact, and how we can prevent them. If the weather holds, we will also have a simple hike to observe why biodiversity helps this process.



February 12 – Wintertime Survival

Learn about the ins and outs of furs, feathers, migration, and physical wintertime adaptations that help animals survive. We will also learn basic fire building, followed by a sweet surprise as part of the program.

March 19 / 26 – Trees, Trees, Trees!

The sap is flowing, and the trees are budding. Let's explore! We'll inspect the maple tree life cycle, and practice basic tree surveying skills that foresters use, like reading tree rings.



April 23 / 30 – Bugs & Amphibians

It's Spring, and our ecosystems are budding after a long winter. Let's inspect who's been hanging out in our bug snags, what creatures are awake in our vernal pools, and more! The more we find, the better it is for our ecosystems.


Year of Exploration Passport


90's Night Information


