ASBURY WOODS Conservation Stewardship Plan Update



Exciting developments are coming to the Woods this summer! Over the past several years, Asbury Woods has worked to ramp up conservation efforts on our 234-acre property. This endeavor started with the planning, publication, and adoption of our Conservation Stewardship Plan in 2023. Implementation of the plan began immediately with invasive species treatments, staff, and volunteer trail maintenance training, acquiring additional acreage, and securing funding to enable us to continue moving forward. Asbury Woods has taken another major step with plan implementation by hiring Conservation Stewardship Coordinator, Greg Ritson. Greg's years of experience in trail management, conservation, and volunteer training will catalyze the ongoing work to preserve and protect our property for current and future generations.

Asbury Woods is proud to welcome tens of thousands of visitors to the property each year through educational programs and outdoor recreation. However, this heavy use leaves a lasting impression on the land. The combination of a Conservation Stewardship Coordinator, the Conservation Stewardship Plan, and funding, means Asbury Woods can work to reduce human impacts on the property, improve habitats for plants and wildlife, and deliver a better experience for current and future visitors.

Visitors can expect to see trail improvements and restoration activities this summer and beyond. There will also be opportunities for the public to get involved through vernal pool investigations in June, a white-tailed deer census in July, and trail improvement projects throughout the summer. Thanks to our private conservation funders, and a Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program grant from Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development, Asbury Woods is ready to launch our conservation efforts in a big way.

We invite all Asbury Woods supporters to engage in conservation of the property through volunteerism, participation in programs, financial support, and continuing to love the Woods!




